MINISTRY SPOTLIGHT

Department of Youth Faith Formation: The Next Generation of Faith

Working with young people and their families from baptism to twelfth grade, the Department of Youth Faith Formation (DYFF) helps the next generation of Catholics foster and strengthen their beliefs. DYFF works with nearly all parishes in the archdiocese to coach their team on determining and establishing the best practices and methods for the implementation of their parish's faith formation programs. Boldness and creativity are their motto in carrying out Cardinal Dolan's vision for our youth and navigating the diverse realities of our parish communities. One notable effort is the Family Formation Program at St. Marianne Cope Parish in Cornwall-on-Hudson. Founded on the Church's prayer at the baptismal rite that

parents be the first and best teachers of their children in the faith, Family Formation at St. Marianne Cope Parish provides a monthly family-based curriculum that includes adult catechesis to make living the faith a way of life. Children learn with catechists; parents receive training for weekly lessons to bring the conversation about Christ to the home. The family becomes more and more the "domestic Church," so every child (and parent!) can experience the Presence of Jesus where two or three are gathered in His Name.

The Family Formation Program has helped introduce our children to Christ and his Church in a meaningful way. "Going through the program with their children allows

Ela Milewska, Executive Director of the DYFF, noted that many people who help carry out their mission are volunteers who choose to spend time with the youth. They are motivated to take up such a task because they want young people to know Jesus. The volunteers are guided by Parish Faith Formation Coordinators. The archdiocese offers free services like catechist and youth ministry team formation and training. The operating support provided by the Appeal has given the DYFF the opportunity to invest in young people and their faith. Events


like these are annual examples of how the generosity of parishioners are making an incredible difference in the lives of our young people, ensuring that our Catholic faith and practice remain at the center of their development.
