he Cardinal's Annual Steward-ship Appeal exists to make Christ present in the world around us. Through the pastoral work in the 288 parishes of the Archdiocese of New York, the competitive education and spiritual formation in our 128 parish-based, Catholic schools, the wide-ranging ministries serving the community, and the charitable works that have become the cornerstone of the Appeal, our donors are helping us bring hope and care to those who are most in need every day.

The work of the *Appeal*, as we have discovered over the course of 40 years of service, adapts to the evolving needs of communities across the ten counties that comprise the Archdiocese of New York. The needs of each region

vary according to geography and population; and, in that sense, we depend on those who are aware of the needs in their neighboring communities to give generously. The work of the *Appeal* is accomplished in community; and, together, we ensure that those parishes serving the most vulnerable among us, have the assistance, the services, and resources they need.

The Leadership Committee is instrumental in this task. The committee consists of donors and volunteers who collaborate closely with the Executive Director of Development and the Director of the Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal to help the archdiocese achieve its mission of providing financial and ministerial support to the parishes of the archdiocese and the people of New York. Strategic planning, community outreach, and execution are fundamental aspects of their role in the Appeal.

AREAS OF SUPPORT

he Cardinal's Annual Steward-ship Appeal seeks to respond to the changing needs of an archdiocese marked by continued growth and a diversity of cultures. These have been hallmarks of the region for generations. The areas of support vary according to the practical and ministerial priorities of the archdiocese as a whole, the parishes that comprise it,

and the constituencies they serve. The 2019 campaign focused on four areas essential to the Life of the Church in New York: Assistance for Needy Parishes, Pastoral and Administrative Support, Formation of New Parish Priests, Funding for Parish Schools, and the Home for Retired Priests, St. John Vianney Center. Here's a breakdown of assistance:

PASTORAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE ASSISTANCE

ith over 288 parishes across ten counties, the Cardinal's Appeal funds the administrative personnel and the infrastructure that help parishes effectively serve their communities. Through the Appeal, the archdiocese helps train and staff countless ministries with over 1.000 staff members and pastoral leaders supporting the mission of each parish and their unique financial goals. Your contributions also enable parishes to certify leaders of religious education programs for 74,735 children, provide programming for adult faith formation, and guide parishes in establishing youth and young adult ministries. They

are preparing the way for tomorrow's Church.

In times of crisis, this infrastructure allows parishes to mobilize and reach out to the community in ways that are needed the most. Since the outbreak of COVID-19, our priests have been ceaselessly ministering to their communities, offering pastoral care, guidance, and support. They are also making use of digital platforms to share the Mass and connect with their congregations. Trained staff members and ministries comprise existing networks of outreach and communication that allow parishes to maintain a sense of

community in times of social distancing while also serving as clear points of contact for those most affected by the crisis. Funerals, confession, last rites, and charitable outreach are all made possible in these challenging times because of your generosity to the *Cardinal's Appeal* in 2019.

FUNDING FOR PARISH SCHOOLS

Our schools not only prepare their students for higher education with national statistics out-pacing many of their public school counterparts, but they are intentionally forming the leaders of tomorrow. The values afforded by a Catholic school education also provide an informed filter for the content and information

students encounter as they navigate a digital culture, giving them a greater sense of confidence in the world.

This school year brought with it unforeseen closures and record unemployment in New York and around the country. You'll be glad to know that funds raised through the *Appeal* in 2019 are helping to bridge the financial divide for families. The needs remain great. We welcome your continued support to ensure that these students and their families are able to stay the course and reach their academic goals.





FORMATION OF NEW PARISH PRIESTS

e have heard it said time and again: we need vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Thanks to your support of the *Appeal*, those who have been called, receive the education and formation that will enable them to become the pastors of tomorrow. At St. Joseph's Seminary, 27 men

are currently attending classes, earning degrees and receiving the liturgical training required for their priestly call. In addition to this, they are receiving the administrative, technological, and interpersonal skills that every leader needs in order to succeed in today's world.

ASSISTANCE FOR NEEDY PARISHES

Lt any given time, up to 31 parishes receive financial assistance from your contributions to the Cardinal's Appeal. During the public health crisis that we are currently facing that number has grown to include more than half of our 288 parishes. With Masses suspended, the weekly collections that support the parishes have been greatly diminished. This, at a time when a great number of people in communities throughout New York City and the upper counties are facing medical, financial, and spiritual challenges as a result of the pandemic. Thanks to your support, the Cardinal's Appeal is there

to support our pastors and parishes on the frontlines of this crisis.

The most vulnerable among us are the ones who suffer the most during times of crisis. These communities, naturally, turn to their parishes for assistance, for guidance, and care, even in the best of times. Our sisters and brothers in underserved areas are looking to their church for assistance during this unprecedented time of need. And we will be there for them. Food pantries, homeless services, community outreach, and the operational infrastructure necessary to keep these programs running are found in

many of our parishes as a matter of course; this, in addition, to the liturgical life that gives these services sacramental expression. Your continued support of the *Appeal* ensures that we are equipped to serve all people in need when they approach our parishes for help.

A HOME FOR RETIRED PARISH PRIESTS



ixty-three of our beloved former pastors reside at the beautiful St. John Vianney Center. There, they can participate in daily Mass, socialize with their brother priests and live in accommodations designed for those with medical issues that limit their mobility. The Center is capable of providing more intensive treatment to those who require it in a 13-bed enhanced care unit. This is more impor-

tant today than ever before. With your support of the *Appeal*, we are able to make sure that these men - who devoted their lives to serving the faithful of the archdiocese - are provided with the appropriate shelter and care they need at this particularly difficult time for our seniors. We ask that you please keep our retired priests and their caregivers in your prayers during this public health crisis.






FORTY YEARS OPENING THE DOORS TO OUR FAITH


